



Batangas

Batangas is a province that is famous for excellent dive sites and the world's lowest volcano. It is a thriving tourist destination replete with open beaches and sheltered coves, subterranean caves and deep harbors, a preserved heritage and brave men in history.

Found in the province is world-known Anilao and its many dive sites that are ideal for poking around and observing marine life, and outstanding for macro photography. Multi-hued crinoids are prolific. The variety of nudibranchs is unmatched. Night dives are especially nice and often reveal unusual creatures like sea hares, sea goblins, catfish eels, ghost pipe fishes, blue-ringed octopuses, mandarin fishes, and snake eels. The area's best known dive site, coral-covered Cathedral is spectacular at night. One of the

prettiest dives in the area, Sepok has nice coral gardens and a vertical wall.

Taal Lake and Volcano in Batangas is Southern Luzon's centerpiece attraction. Known to be the smallest in the world, it is a volcano within an islet within a lake within a crater within a volcano. The town of Taal reigns as one of the two most culturally preserved sites of the Spanish colonial era; the other is Vigan in Ilocos Sur. The village in Taal conforms to the old town layout combining the municipal hall, school, church, and houses.

Among the multitude of popular tourism activities to be had in the province are heritage tours, pilgrimage tours, scuba diving, shopping, mountain climbing and trekking, swimming, and snorkeling. Batangas is located only 110 kilometers south of Metropolitan Manila, and is very accessible from the national capital by land.

Day 1 - Manila-Tagaytay

Morning departure from Manila to Tagaytay. Proceed to a tour of Tagaytay Ridge which offers a magnificent view of the smallest and lowest volcano in the world, Taal Volcano, resting in the middle of serene Taal Lake. A deceptive tranquility; notable are the eruptions in 1716 and 1754 where ashes spewed by the volcano darkened the skies combined with rains and thunder, massive earthquakes, and gigantic waves driving the residents around the lake to the inner towns for refuge. The 1911 eruption claimed 1,300 lives, and 300 more in 1965 burying 6 barrios. Visit People's Park in the Sky providing a picturesque 360 degrees view of the three provinces south of Metro Manila and westward to the sea. The tour also provides a visit to GBR Museum which houses more than 3,000 vintage paintings and photographs of the Philippines, antique maps and imperial glass pieces from China and other vintage articles. Lunch will be taken in a cozy restaurant overlooking the lake & the volcano. Check-in at the hotel for dinner and overnight. (L/D)



Day 2 - Tagaytay-Taal Trekking-Tagaytay

Breakfast at the hotel. Drive down to the town of Talisay in Batangas, the jump-off point to Taal Volcano. Upon arrival, board motorized outriggers to the island volcano 30 minutes away. Light trekkers can view the caldera from the rim of the crater. Islanders are renting out horses for minimal fee. Strong trekkers can hike through the expanse of hardened black lava up to an easy incline and down to the crater for a close-up view of the caldera. The lake inside the crater invites hikers to a relaxing swim. Return to a shoreline resort for a sumptuous lunch. Return to Tagaytay for dinner and overnight at the hotel. (B/L/D)

Day 3 - Tagaytay-Villa Escudero-Manila



After breakfast, check-out of the hotel and proceed to the quaint and historic Villa Escudero, amidst coconut palms, reminiscent of old plantation life. Highlight of the tour is a family museum of archaeological artifacts and private collections of antique relics from Pre-History, Spanish time and World War II. Local folks will serenade you on board water buffalo-drawn carts that transport you going to a man-made waterfalls that provides hydroelectric power to the plantation. Lunch is served on tables set over a flowing stream. On weekends, a cultural show is presented for the delight of plantation visitors. Return to Manila after the tour for your next destination. (B/L)
